2007 Incoming Transfer Student Kettering Merit Scholarships

Kettering Merit Scholarships reward academic excellence and hard work. All accepted transfer applicants who meet the following criteria will receive a Kettering Merit Scholarship. At the time of acceptance, students will receive their initial scholarship award. Below are general guidelines outlining potential student scholarship awards. Each student will receive an aid package that is unique to him or her. All students are strongly encouraged to attend a Prep for Success Conference to compete for additional scholarships up to full-tuition.

Kettering Merit Scholarship

- In state students with a GPA of 3.5 or above will receive an annual award of \$4,000
- Out of state students with a GPA of 3.5 or above will receive an annual award of \$6,000

- In state students with a GPA of 3.0 - 3.49 will receive an annual award of \$2,000
- Out of state students with a GPA of 3.0 - 3.49 will receive an annual award of \$4,000

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships

- Annual award of \$3,000 with a GPA of 3.5 or above and 30 credit hours
- Annual award of \$5,000 with a GPA of 3.5 and an Associates Degree in Pre-Engineering or Engineering Science

Automation Alley Scholarships

- Two \$5000 awards available to students of employees of Automation Alley member organizations. Contact Financial Aid Office

Arman Omedian Scholarship

- Annual award of \$1000 to transfer students from Grand Rapids Community College. Apply online at www.grcf.egrant.org and/or www.grfoundation.org. Restrictions apply.

Kettering Merit Scholarships may be partly funded through the support of gifts from our generous friends and donors. Kettering University also awards need-based aid. In addition, a student's earnings from professional co-op can help offset the costs associated with a student's education. Kettering students earn between \$40,000-\$65,000 over the course of the professional co-op program.

IMPORTANT NOTE: ALL students are encouraged to file a Free Application For Financial Aid (FAFSA) to take advantage of the University's need-based aid and state and federal gift aid.
